Pentecost



Today we celebrate Pentecost, when God's Holy Spirit came to the first Christians. Jesus's disciples had been waiting in Jerusalem, as he had told them to, and were blessed with the gifts of the Spirit which gave them the strength and the courage to become God's Church - Jesus's body on earth.

This is why we sometimes call Pentecost the Church's birthday - it was the day the Church was born!



Today we will think about our reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

We hear what happened on the first Pentecost, when the disciples saw, heard and felt strange things when the Spirit came. Wind and fire are metaphors. It does not say there WAS wind and fire but that something strange and mysterious and powerful happened. The only way people could describe what happened was to say it was LIKE wind and fire. Note that the important thing was not the wind or the flames, but that people knew for sure that God was with them in a very powerful way.

Knowing that gave the disciples (who were hiding out in fear) the courage to run into the streets and tell everyone they met about Jesus. Knowing that gives us the courage to follow Jesus today.

Jesus says that while he was alive on the earth, God was with people in him, but now that he has died and risen, God will be with them as the Holy Spirit. They will feel God's love burning in them and God's power will enable them to do amazing things.






Filled with the Holy Spirit
