In the same way, after supper he took the cup; when he had given you thanks he gave it to them and said, Drink this, all of you; this cup is the new covenant in my blood poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins: do this as often as you drink it in remembrance of me.

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come in glory.

Therefore, loving God, recalling now the sacrifice of Christ your Son once for all upon the cross and the triumph of his resurrection, we ask you to accept this our sacrifice of praise.

Send your Holy Spirit on us that we may be filled with your life and goodness and renewed for the service of your Kingdom Unite us in Christ and give us your peace that we may do your work and be his body in the world. Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

The Invitation to Holy Communion

If you are not receiving you are welcome to come forward for a blessing but please bring this leaflet with you as a signal to the priest.
