Let us proclaim the mystery of faith: Christ has died.
Christ is risen.
Christ will come in glory.

Therefore, loving God, recalling now the sacrifice of Christ your Son once for all upon the cross and the triumph of his resurrection, we ask you to accept this our sacrifice of praise.

#### **Today's Readings**

#### Daniel 7. 9-10, 13-14

The prophet Daniel tells of his vision of the powers arrayed in rebellion against God and the coming of the Son of Man to take his rightful place as ruler over all the earth.

#### Psalm 93

#### Revelation 1. 4b-8

The prophet John speaks of Jesus Christ, using the same language that Daniel used for the Son of Man. Jesus is the one to whom all dominion has been given and his followers await his return in glory.

#### John 18. 33-37

Jesus speaks of the nature of his kingship and his kingdom when questioned by Pilate.
