A reading from the letter to the Hebrews.

Christ did not enter a sanctuary made by human hands, a mere copy of the true one, but he entered into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf. Nor was it to offer himself again and again, as the high priest enters the Holy Place year after year with blood that is not his own; for then he would have had to suffer again and again since the foundation of the world. But as it is, he has appeared once for all at the end of the age to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself. And just as it is appointed for mortals to die once, and after that the judgement, so Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin, but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup; when he had given you thanks he gave it to them and said, Drink this, all of you; this cup is the new covenant in my blood poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins: do this as often as you drink it in remembrance of me.

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith: Christ has died.
Christ is risen.
Christ will come in glory.

Therefore, loving God, recalling now the sacrifice of Christ your Son once for all upon the cross and the triumph of his resurrection, we ask you to accept this our sacrifice of praise.

Send your Holy Spirit on us that we may be filled with your life and goodness and renewed for the service of your Kingdom Unite us in Christ and give us your peace that we may do your work and be his body in the world. The Invitation to Holy Communion

All those who are baptised (Christened) are welcome to receive Holy Communion today. Baptised (Christened) children are welcome to receive holy communion at the discretion of their parents.

If you are not receiving you are welcome to come forward for a blessing but please bring this leaflet with you as a signal to the priest.

Jonah 3. 1-5, 10

After a reluctant start and deep-sea adventures, Jonah sets out to preach God's message of repentance to the people of Nineveh. He receives an overwhelmingly positive response from small and great alike.

Psalm 62. 5-12

Hebrews 9. 24-end

The writer to the Hebrews draws his argument together: Christ is the fulfilment of the Jewish Law. The repeated ritual of Jewish sacrifice models Christ's once-for-all sacrifice that opens the way to God permanently.

Mark 1. 14-20

Having introduced Jesus, Mark continues his fast-paced Gospel with the calling of the fishermen, Simon, Andrew, James and John, from their daily work on the lake. Their response is immediate and unwavering.

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
